GOD'S SIDE IN WAR

AUBURN.—Pray that this nation be on the right side, the side the Lord is always on, in this war, appealed the Rev. Leslie Whalen, assistant pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, and former Moderator of St. Mary's Sodality, in a stirring address to the Senior and Junior Sodality of Mary of St. Mary's Church here.

Father Whalen spoke at the annual covered dish supper in Lyceum Hall, Jan. 8.

Brief remarks were made by the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen, pastor; the Rev. Joseph McNamara, the Rev. Dennis Hickey, Sodality Moderator; the Rev. Edward Agony, O.M.C.; Miss Maryrose Barron, senior president, and Miss Miriam Hickey, junior president.

In urging the Sodality to pray that the nation may be on the right side, Father Whalen remarked: "But, you say, both sides pray. Which side can God be on?"

"The answer is neither, to the exclusion of the other," he stated. "God judges us not by our nationality but by our justice—not by our flags, but by our hearts. God is with the just Germans who are crushed with Hitler, but He is not with Pagan Germany."

"Every nation that fears God and works justly is acceptable to God. We are scandalized at Godless Russia and Pagan Germany, but do we ever think of the 60 percent of Americans growing up without any formal religious education? Suppose they are allowed to live out their Godlessness. Then we would have tyranny."

In answer to the question "Why doesn't God stop this war?" Father Whalen quoted and replied to H. G. Wells.

Wells remark cited was "If I thought there was a God able to stop war, stop this slaughter of mankind, able to prevent all the tragedy of human suffering and he refused to do it. I would spit in His empty face." Father Whalen's reply was:

"Could God stop this war? Certainly, He could, but only by destroying free will, our most precious gift. What H. G. Wells would have is that man have free will and yet be incapable of choosing right from wrong. He wants a slave and a free man at the same time."

"H. G. Wells would blame God. The only time he would think of God is when he wants to blame some one. God is like the dentist. The only time one ever thinks of him is when one's tooth aches. The only difference between God and the dentist is that God is always to blame but one never blames the dentist for the toothache."

"You know peace departs when each man seeks his own desires. The desires which are born of hate, jealousy and ambition."

Stressing the need for prayer and reception of the Sacraments, Father Whalen declared that "God's part in this war is clear. Ask and you shall receive."

Miss Margaret Hanlon presided as toastmistress. Community singing was enjoyed with Gerald T. Conroy at the piano.
