6,000 Culion Colony **Patients Imperilled**

Many of the \$000 Catholic lepers on the Island of Culion in the Philippines will die of starvation within a month unless the Japsness blockade of the colony is lifted, declared the Rev Hugh J. McNulty, S.J., former chaplain of Culion new realding: at Brooklyn Preparatory School. Father Mc-Nulty returned to the States in 1928, after having spont six years with the Repers.

Normally, it is not a large amount which each leper receives, because the government allows them only 5 cents a day for food.

HEW NAZI PENAL CODE FOR POLES, JEWS ENACTED

WASHINGTON. - The Polish Embassy here has confirmed the report of a Nazi decree this year establishing a new penal code for Poles and Jews in the territories incorporated into the Reich.

The Embassy said so details of the new code are in its possession.
