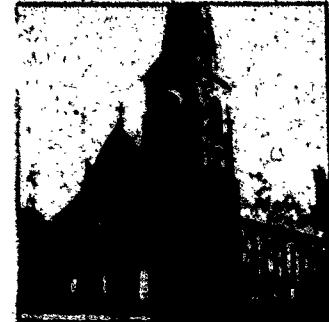
CATHOLIC CHAPLAINS IN ICELAND

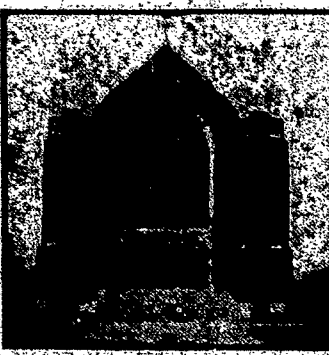
