U. S. Nuns Serve As Nurses With Forces At Manila

SOUTH BEND, Ind.—Two Holy Cross sisters from St. Mary's Notre Dame, are serving as nurses with the United States forces at Manila, P. I., according to a cablegram received by Mother M. Vincentia, Superior General of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Cross.

The two Sisters, Sisters M. Olive and Casillus, were en route to Holy Cross missions in Bengal, India, when the recent Pacific situation held them at Manila with orders to return home. This morning's cable advises that the Sisters are situated at St. Mary's Hall, Manila, the house of the Maryknoll community, and are doing army nursing.

AID 1076 PERSONS
