Ad Altare Dei Awards Listed At Cathedral

Partaking in the national celebration of Boy Scout Sunday Feb. 8, Catholic Scouts of the Rochester Diocese will conduct special services in the observance of this day.

Scouts and leaders of Catholic-sponsored Troops throughout the Diocese will attend Mass and re-

ceive Holy Communion in a body in their parish churches this morning. In many churches breakfast will be served the group after Mass, while in others the parents of the Scouts join their sons at the altar rail to receive Holy Communion.

Afternoon services for the Catholic Scouts will be held in key cities throughout the Diocese. Scouts Sea Scouts, Cubs and Leaders of the Rochester, Red Jacket and Genesee Councils will attend services in the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart. Rev. Joseph E. Vogt, Diocesan Chaplain, has announced that Rev. Albert L. Limonetti, Rochester Area Chaplain, is in charge of arrangements.

Services, beginning at 3:30 o'clock will include prayers for American victory, presentation of the Ad Altare Dei Awards, and Benediction.



Rt. Reverend Msgr. Charles F. Shay, pastor of Holy Rosary Church, will officiate, while Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns, pastor of the Pro-Cathedral will bless the colors. Rev. Charles J. 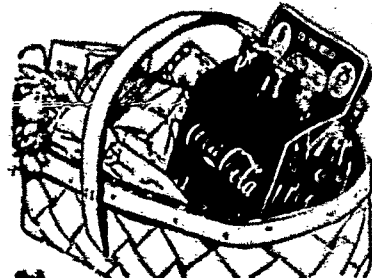
For the entertainment of all attending there will be appropriate table prizes, refreshments and
