Fr. Carey Dies In Nebraska

Friends here have been saddened by word of the death of the Very Rev. John J. Carey, pastor of Holy Family Church, Heartwell, Nebraska, who died in his sleep at his rectory, Sunday night of last week.

Father Carey was born Jan. 1, 1876, in this city and made all his studies for the Holy Priesthood here completing his courses at St. Bernard's Seminary in 1902. He was ordained here for the diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska, on Jan. 14, 1902. He has been pastor of the Heartwell parish since 1935.

With His Excellency, the Most Rev. Louis B. Kucera, Bishop of Lincoln officiating, Solemn Pontifical Requiem Mass was offered at the funeral services for Father Carey in Holy Family Church, Heartwell. Burial was in Calvary Cemetery, Lincoln.

The first pastorate of the former Rochesterian was at Minden, Nebraska. He also served in parishes in Friend, Harvard, Aurora and York. He was pastor in Fairbury from 1910 to 1928 and of Blessed Sacrament Church, Lincoln, from February, 1930, to April, 1931.

Father Carey was dean of his district from November, 1936 to January, 1938 and was state chaplain of the Catholic Daughters of America in 1937-1938.

A widely known lecturer and writer, he had many of his addresses published in newspapers throughout the diocese.

His own epitaph, the Southern Nebraska Register states, might well be taken from his famous address, "The Spirit of the Pioneer," the concluding paragraph of which reads:

"Happy are we to behold the pioneer, to know his spirit, to see his footprints on the long, long trail. To think a new thought, to grasp an opportunity, to love the struggle, to wait patiently, to en-

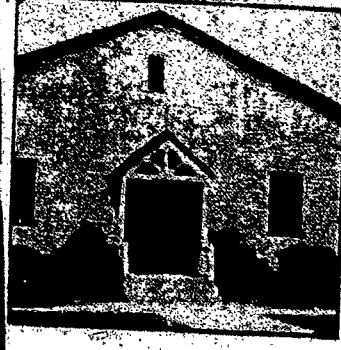
