

Sixth Christian Culture Lecture Slated

Exiled Archduke Will Discuss Europe At Aquinas Institute

Now in exile with his mother, the Empress Zita, the young Archduke Felix of Austria will conclude his American lecture tour next Sunday evening at Aquinas Institute Auditorium, Dewey Ave. Presented as the sixth lecturer in the Christian Culture Series, Archduke Felix has entitled his address on Feb. 8 at 8:30 P. M., "Europe, Today and Tomorrow."

A devout Catholic, graduate of the great Louvain University in Belgium, a scion of the once mighty dynasty of the Hapsburgs, the Archduke, now only 25 years old, combines in his person the traditional Catholic culture of the old Austria with the Christian hope of the now enslaved peoples of Europe.
