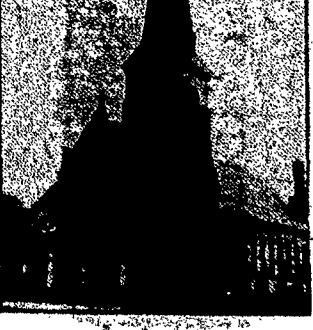
ITALIAN TRANSLATION
