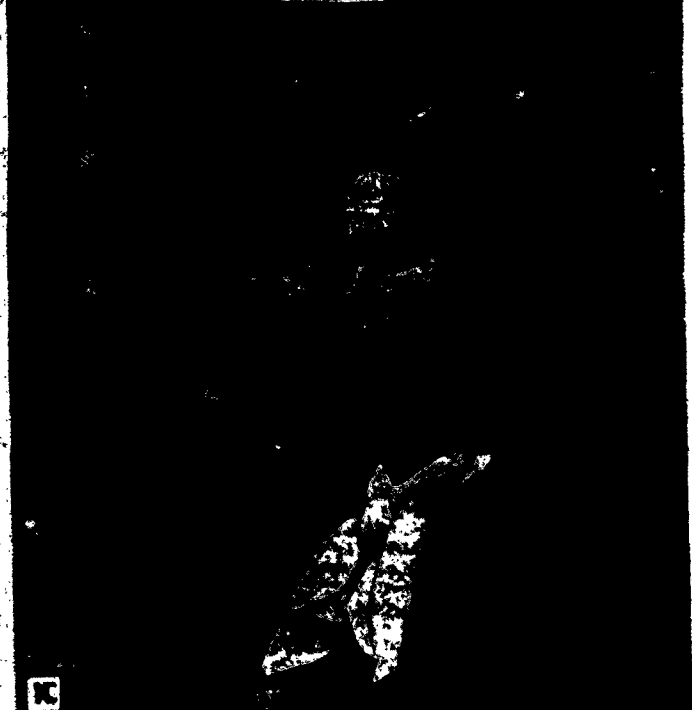
Catholic School Infirmary To Become Defense Hospital
