The Pastor goes to his people weekly for parish income; the Bishop approaches his people in all the parishes of the diocese yearly. Loyalty to our Bishop, eagerness to help him meet his responsibility, and a realization of our obligation to help him meet every diocesan need, will prompt us to a generous contribution to the Annual Diocesan Needs Collection on Feb. 22. Envelopes will be given out Sunday, Feb. 15.

### Ask Clergy To Allay Fears of Aliens

had dates, except (1) persons confined to asylums, jails or penitentiaries; (2) persons confined to institutions or their places of residence because of age or infirmity, and (3) persons temporarily bedridden in hospitals or their places of residence.

Written Notice—Persons in the third category must apply for their certificates within five days of their recovery. In order to qualify for this deferment of application, persons temporarily incapacitated must give written notice, accompanied by a doctor's certificate, within the period fixed for the filing of applications for Certificates of Identification.

In case anyone in any of the three excepted categories has not previously registered in compliance with the Alien Registration Act of 1940, he must give notice of this fact, or cause such notice to be given in his behalf.

In applying for his certificate of identification an alien is required to bring with him to the post office three copies of a photograph of himself, two inches by two inches in dimensions, taken not more than 30 days before. He is also required to bring with him his alien registration cards.

### British Bishop Warns Of Hasty War Weddings

LONDON—Declaring that hasty war weddings often "led to utter misery," the Bishop of Salford, the Most Rev. H. Marshall, said in an interview "they follow a rapid courtship and the couple often do not realize the implications." Girls, the Bishop said, are marrying fighting men with a smother of sentiment and with a vision of glamor and with no regard to the future. "But, he added, so long as the law permits them there is no way of putting a stop to these marriages, which spread misery and perplexity."

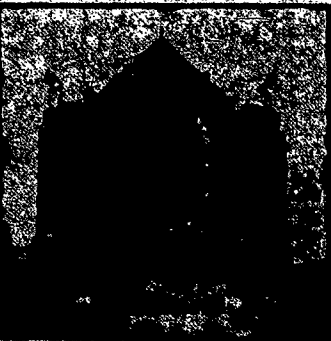
