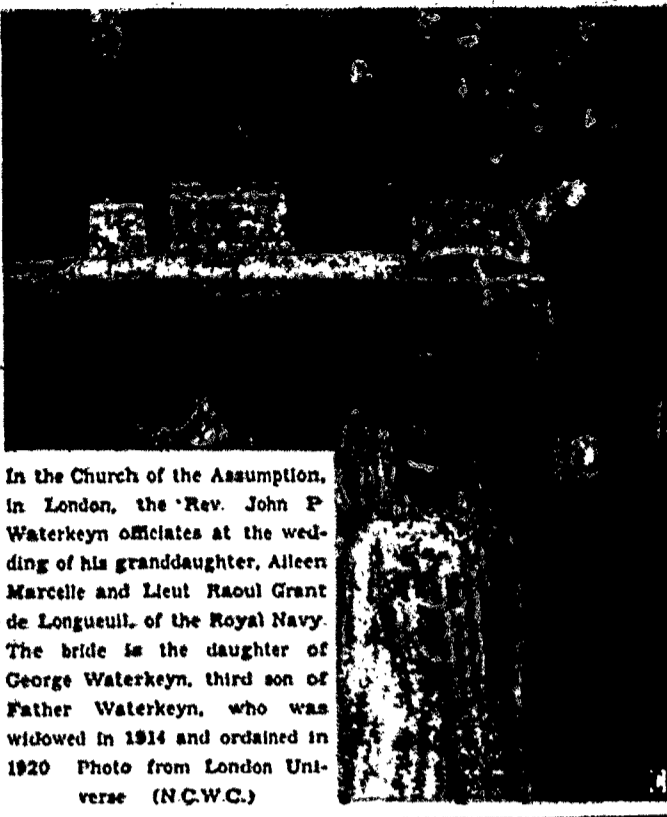

Archduke Felix In Lecture

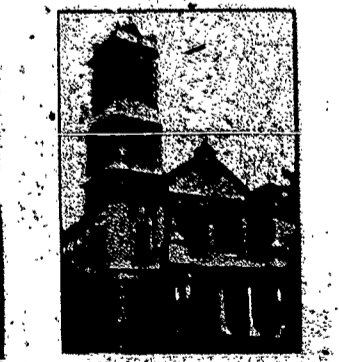

The groups which should form this European democracy are the following: Central Europe with Austria as the center, the Balkans, Poland with the small Balkan countries, and the Scandinavian countries. Each of these groups have natural defense boundaries which are a military necessity. This proposed union should be organized only on a basis of proportional representation according to the language and customs of the many people included in this territory.

Archduke Felix not only clarified but also vitiated the so-called present-day opinion which is held by many that Austria is pro-German. He said that Austria had been fighting against Germany for five years until she finally became the first victim of the Nazi war-machine. "Even though the Austrians speak the German language, this does not mean that they agree with them in their culture, character, or even accent of language."
