

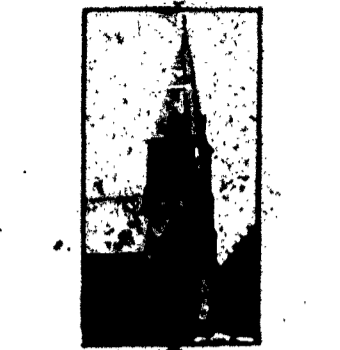

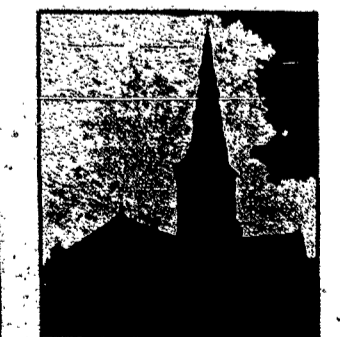

#### PUPILS SPUR BOND SALE

HORNELL.—Students of St. Ann's High School and Grammar School are making a creditable showing in the city-wide drive for the sale of Defense Bonds and Stamps.
