The Need of the Day

It is doubtful whether there ever were times when the need of the Catholic Press was more urgent than in these exceptionally precarious days.

It is still a sad fact that most of our country's secular influence perverts its maintaining educational standards and social theories that state man's duties without reference to God. They insist on reducing moral duties to mere customs or social adjustments.

Every thinking and seriously analytic citizen will furthermore agree that graver dangers to home, country and God have recently arisen. Our people, now during war, need moral stimulation and a greater intellectual appreciation of true values of life more than in the past. Faithful can not supply this in an effective degree. Only the Catholic Press can furnish this through Catholic papers, and magazines generally circulated and read.

Another condition has arisen that may make attendance at Sunday Masses either impossible or safely excusable, particularly in rural districts, on account of the embargo on cars and automobile necessities. A Catholic paper in these homes might well become the only practical contact with God and religion.

Some priests and people who sincerely appreciate God's cause should inter Press Month work with a zeal and not greater than ever before.
