## LENTEN SERMONS LISTED

HORNELL — The Rev. Joseph Donovan, assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church, will deliver a series of Lenten sermons, beginning Sunday evening, Feb. 22, at 7:30 o'clock. His first talk will be on "The End That Is The Beginning." Father Donovan will speak each Sunday evening during Lent. The theme of the series of talks will be the psychological study of the characters of the Passion of Our Lord. The complete list of Father Donovan's sermons during Lent is as follows:

- "The End That Is The Beginning."
  - "Modern Pilates."
  - "The Gethsemane of Every Life."
  - "The Everyday Judas."
  - "Christ's Judgment and Ours."
  - "Fetters of Generosity."
- The Sunday evening sermons will be preceded by the recitation of the Rosary and followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

## K. of C. Hear Talks

The Knights of Columbus held their annual pre-Lenten dinner last Sunday evening at the club rooms on Broadway. The party was very well attended.

The Rev. Andrew T. Dissett of St. Ann's parish and the Rev. William Cannon of Addison were the principal speakers of the evening. Father Dissett told of the essential part the Knights of Columbus will play in the present war. He cited numerous incidents to explain the responsible part the Knights of Columbus had in the last war, and briefly outlined their history of service.

Father Cannon's talk was entitled "A Vocation Within A Vocation." Father Cannon pointed out that members of the Knights of Columbus should strive for the supernatural love of God and their fellow-men. He compared this love to the ideal realized by Father Damien in his works and sacrifices in the leper colony.

Harold Hogue was toastmaster at the dinner.

## Lenten Rules

Lenten regulations were announced at all the Masses last Sunday, and a schedule of the regular Lenten devotions at St. Ann's Church was made known. Parishioners were urged to attend daily Mass, and to spend at least 15 minutes besides the time allotted to the Mass in prayer and meditation before the Tabernacle, in accordance with the wishes of Bishop Kearney.

Lenten devotions will be held each Sunday evening at 7:30 o'clock, consisting of Rosary, sermon and Benediction. Stations of the Cross will be said each Friday afternoon at 3:45 o'clock and in the evening at 7:45 o'clock. The usual Novena devotions in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help will be held each Thursday at 3:45 o'clock and 7:45 o'clock.

The public recitation of the Rosary is held each evening at 7:30 o'clock for the welfare of the men in the United States service. All parishioners were urged to make a special effort to attend this brief service each evening.

## Service Honor Roll

The Rev. Andrew T. Dissett, pastor of St. Ann's Church, has requested that the names of all men of the parish who are now serving in some branch of the country's armed forces be either handed in at the rectory or telephoned some time in the immediate future. This list of names is being compiled preparatory to the making of an honor roll, bearing the names of men in the service of the United States.

The perpetual vigil light, burning for the safety of the men in service, before the Shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, has been flanked by two American flags as a constant reminder of parishioners' duties to the men who are in service.

Miss Virginia Nugent has been chairman of all the study clubs which have been and are being organized throughout St. Ann's parish for the Lenten season. A meeting of all leaders of study clubs was held last Tuesday evening in the school to receive pamphlets and instructions as to the best method of directing study group activities.
