War Is Part of Cross Man Must Bear For Misdeeds - Msgr. Sheen

NEW YORK (NC) - "The things of God imply suffering as a prelude to glory," the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, of the Catholic University of America, said here last night in his address over the "Catholic Hour," in discussing the question he said is being asked so frequently at present, "How can God permit war?"

The "Catholic Hour" is broadcast over the Red Network of the National Broadcasting Company through Station WCAF here and is produced by the National Council of Catholic Men.

Recalling a scene between the Saviour and St. Peter, Monsignor Sheen declared "Our Divine Lord set in contrast 'things of God' and 'things of men.'" "The 'things of God,'" he said, "imply suffering as a prelude to glory; the Cross as a gateway to resurrection; death as the condition of life. In other words, war, suffering, trials and pain, can and do fit into the divine plan."

"The 'things of men,' on the contrary, seek to avoid the cross, to escape the law of sacrifice, or, in the language of the modern psychologists, they seek to be 'self-expressive' - which in less euphemistic language means 'selfishness.' That to Our Divine Lord is 'scandalous.'"

"Applying this lesson to our own times," Monsignor Sheen continued: "Why cannot the Divine Saviour Who once in His human nature, chose Good Friday, choose it now again in all those who are incorporated under His Headship? True, He can never suffer again in the human nature He took from Mary, and which is now at the right hand of the Father; but He can suffer again in other human natures, in His Mystical Body, which is the Church. Cannot He Who once set His face to Jerusalem now set it toward Berlin, or Moscow, or Warsaw, or anywhere where Truth is crucified? Do not the Cross and the Passion need to be actualized in each new age? Is Calvary only a historical event which happened once and will never happen again, or is it a law, which operates whenever evil becomes concentrated in persecution and injustice, that goodness sacrifices itself like a true soldier, that the world perish not?"

Rules Religious Books Can Stay In Schools

MEXICO CITY (NC) - The presence of books of a "religious scientific character" in a school cannot be regarded as anything more than a means of illustration and neither Article 3 of the Constitution nor the Federal Education Law authorizes the setting up of a list of prohibited books, the Supreme Court has decided.

The decision was handed down in upholding an opinion of Magistrate Octavio Mendoza Gonzalez in the case of Professor Maria Concepcion Castro, head of the Institute Franco-Ingles, who had been fined 1,000 pesos by the Ministry of Public Education after an inspector reported he had found in the school library books on pedagogical matters containing religious illustrations.

Nun's Insignia Design Wins Her Air Corps Honors

DURBUQUE, Ia. (NC) - As designer of the officially adopted insignia of the Flying Knights Squadron, new naval aviation corps from this area, Sister Mary Gabriel, B.V.M. of Clarke College here, will receive honorary membership in the squadron at special ceremonies Sunday, February 22.

The design submitted by Sister Gabriel, who heads the Clarke College art department, won first place among hundreds of entries in a recent contest sponsored by six leading newspapers of the Middle West.

She will receive one of the official insignias at the ceremonies at Moline, Ill. Airport. Outstanding feature of her design is a gold eagle, with wings spread in the shape of a 'V'.
