FOR NATIVE VOCATIONS

Father Lynch at Corpus Christi, Sunday, Mar. 1—to speak at all the Masses on the work of his society, the Society of St. Peter the Apostle for Native Vocations. Sodallists Bouquet Totals For Pope's Jubilee Should Be Sent To Queen's Work

ST. LOUIS.—Totals in the Sodallists' spiritual bouquet for the Holy Father on the occasion of his twenty-fifth anniversary as a bishop, May 13, should be sent to The Queen's Work here, national Sodality secretariate, as early in March as possible to insure prompt arrival in Rome. A notice to Sodallists added the grand totals would be compiled here. Masses, Holy Communion, visits, ways of the cross, series and various other prayers, mortifications and acts of virtue are suggested for the intention of Pope Pius XII, a Sodallist since his school days.

An article to appear in the March issue of The Queen's Work, national Sodality organ, which will be off the press late this month, will say, in part:

"At a time like this, when the fate of the Christian world seems in peril and the heart of the father of Christendom is sorely tried, a generous gift from the Sodallists will be most important to Pope Pius XII. It will be a great act of faith in the unity of the Church. It will be an expression of loyalty to the leader of a united Christian world. It will make the Holy Father realize that in the midst of war the intentions of the Prince of Peace are not forgotten."

V.A.O. Needs Typists, Male Clerks

C. F. Sargent, Manager of the Veterans' Administration Facility, Batavia, announces that typist positions are available in the Veterans' Administration Offices, Washington, D. C., at an entrance salary of \$1,200 per annum. Appointment to these positions will be made without delay and subsequent to the assignment to duty in Washington, the employee will be expected to file application papers with the Civil Service Commission in Washington. Having passed the regular Civil Service examination, these applicants will be classified as regular employees under the United States Civil Service. The applicants should be not less than 18 years of age and must have the ability to type at the rate of 20 words per minute.

Mr. Sargent also announces that there are male clerk positions available in the Veterans' Administration Offices, Washington, D.C. These applicants should be not less than 18 years of age and should have the physical ability to perform heavy duty work, including standing most of the day. Positions of male clerk will carry an entrance salary of \$1,200 per annum. Young men appointed to these positions may also qualify under Civil Service rules subsequent to appointment to duty in Washington. All persons interested in qualifying for the above positions must visit the Veterans Administration Facility Office at Batavia, for an interview.
