

Church Alone Stands Out

Agaihst Nazism In Germany



Accounts Reveal How Exemplary Catholic Youthe Met Death In Heroic Manner.

SAN FRANCISCO-Emerging still from the smoke and debris of the Pearl Harbor debacle are stories of the valor.

Joe Nelles was "a fine Catholic soldier." He died that way. On the fateful morning of Dec. 7 he attended the 6:30 Man at Hickam rended the eight many ac ritcham Field with several hundred other boys. He received Hely Com-munion and then without break-fast prepared the atter for the 5:30 Mane. As he was thus engaged three Johaness bombs struck the builting, lavelling the structure in functionates. minutes.

Later Father Edward Sliney, the post chaplain, went to the razed building. There he found Joe Nelles-lying in front of the spot where the high altar had been. A Knight of the Altar had made the aupreme sacrifice.

Another Joe - Joe Silva lived through it, became a five hero. Only God knows why he isn't dead. At the height of the Japanese at-tack on Hickam Field, he saw three gasoline trucks in the midst of falling bomba, probably targets already well within the sights of the enemy bombers. For it involved a permon that recalled an event of sermon that recalled an event of the first World War told while the projecilies of the second fell from the skies all over and about the chapel wherein it was preached. The preacher was Father John Connelly, chapien at another Ha-wallan post. The bombs began to fall just as he started Mass st-fended by 400 solitors and some of tended by 500 soldiers and some of their officers. But none realized that so suddenly, so swiftly, their coustry was at war.

After the First Gospel, Father Connelly spake. His topic was "The Right Way to Die" He did not know of course, that many of his boys would die that very day -the right way He told them of a group of doughboys in the last war going into a dangerous sector and passing a wayside shrine in France. It was a Pieta, a statue of the Blessed Mother with the dead Saviour in her arms.

The boys whispered a prayer as they passed. For some it was their they passed. For some it was their last prayer. The survivors returned the same route. The Pieta was still standing but not all of it was there. The image of the Saviour had been shot away.


