F. J. Sheed Lectures March 15 at Aquinas On 'New Apologetic'

Awakening people to the vitalizing character of Christian thought for several years has been the work of Mr F. J. Sheed of London and New York. The seventh lecture in the popular Christian Culture Lecture Series at Aquinas Institute will be given by Mr Sheed on Sunday evening, Mar. 15, at 8:30 P. M.

Determined to show thinking people that the great heritage of Christian truth contains all the elements needed to satisfy human minds, Mr Sheed had, as a young lawyer founded in London, the famous publishing house of Sheed and Ward. The Ward in the firm is his wife, Maiale Ward, granddaughter of Wilfrid Ward, the biographer of Cardinal Newman.

The Novena's closing will mark the anniversary of the canonization of St. Francis Xavier in whose honor the Novena is conducted and of St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus.

Mission Opens At St. Theodore's

With the Rev. Walter F. Mack, O.M.I., in charge, a two-week mission will be conducted at St. Theodore's Church, 168 Spencerport Road, from Mar. 6 to Mar. 21, it is announced by the Rev. Raymond J. Epping, pastor.

The first week from Mar. 8 to 14 will be for the women and the second week, Mar. 15 to 21, for the men. Masses will be at 6:00 and 7:45 A. M. followed by an instructor. Confessions will be heard each morning after the Masses and each evening after the services beginning Sunday evening. Afternoon confessions will be announced by the Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate.

The Children's Mission will consist of Holy Mass and instruction on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday morning at 7:45 o'clock. The closing will take place on Friday morning, Mar. 13, at 7:45 o'clock. Evening services will be held at 7:45 P. M. each evening and to these Father Epping invites also non-Catholics living within the parish limits. On Friday evening will be Solemn Promulgation of the Law and Renewal of Baptismal Promises. On Saturday evening at the usual hour will be the Act of Consecration, the Enrollment in the Confraternity of the Miraculous Medal and the Imparting of the Papal Blessing.

Children not of school age and infants in arms will be blessed on Sunday afternoon, Mar. 15, at 3:30 o'clock.

Aquinas Teacher Wins Doctorate

The degree of doctor of philosophy has been awarded by Laval University to the Rev. Paul Mallon, C.S.B., director of Modern Languages at Aquinas Institute. It was announced this week from Quebec. Father Mallon earned the degree on his thesis on the work of Rene Bazin, French novelist. The Basilian priest had spent the academic year 1939-1940 in residence at Laval University and previously had studied at St. Michael's College in the University of Toronto, at Columbia University in New York and at various French colleges.

Death came tragically to the boys last Thursday when they were struck by a milk truck driven by Ernest J. Porter. Also injured in the accident were Helen Pale, 11, sister of Edward and Irene Kulczyk, 16, sister of Andrew.
