Word has been received here of the death of Sister Mary George of the Sisters of Notre Dame, at St. Bridget's convent at Westbury, L. I., on Sunday, Feb. 22.

Sister George taught the Eighth and Ninth Grades at SS. Peter and Paul's School for 29 years. Her passing will be mourned by hundreds of her former pupils, who on the occasion of her fiftieth anniversary as a nun, on Aug. 9, 1940, tendered her a reception here which will long be remembered by all who attended.

A Requiem High Mass will be celebrated for the happy repose of her soul, at SS. Peter and Paul's Church, on Saturday, Mar. 14, at 7 A. M., to which all her former pupils and parishioners are invited. Interment was in Westbury, L. I., where the funeral was held on Wednesday, Feb. 25. Rev. J. E. Gaffell, Ph. D., celebrated the funeral Mass.

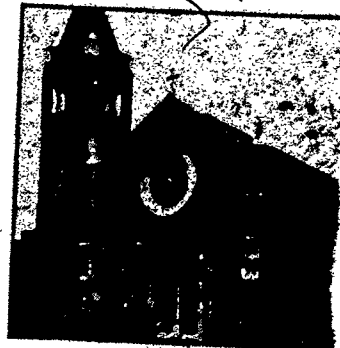
