The next comes from the Sixth Grade South of St. Andrew's School. They desire to ransom an Indian baby named Joseph Patrick in honor of the two Saints of the month of March. For his sponsors they have chosen John Hastings and Geraldine Ferrara.

The boys of the Fourth Grade of St. Andrew's are boasting over the fact that they have the ransom this week ahead of the girls. They would like David Richard Hohn to be his name and he shall be an Indian boy Joseph Cornelius and Joan Jankowski as his godparents.

CHAPEL RETURNS
 During the past week I have made many visits to various schools with the mission movie, "The Flying Priest Over the Arctic." These boys and girls have contributed their small admission fee toward the erection of another Mission Chapel. At Good Counsel School I found the boys and girls most enthusiastic. They gave me a check for \$17.40 on the day of my visit, and the following day I received a nice letter from the Eighth Graders who sent along \$5.00 extra for this same cause. To all of you, I say a hearty "Thank you."

Just as enthusiastic were the boys and girls from St. Francis Xavier School. After the movie they presented me with the large sum of \$15.20 for another Mission Chapel.

Outside the City of Rochester, the boys and girls are just as enthusiastic over the mission program. This was evidenced at my visit to St. John's School in Spencerport where all of the boys and girls were pepped up over the idea of contributing their \$7.50 for the Chapel Fund.

Compline is the simplest and most easily understood Hour of Divine Office. Particularly in the form in which it is prayed on Sunday does this official night prayer of the Church appeal to the Christian soul. It begs for protection from "the plague that prowleth in the dark," for peace, blessing and repose.

Vespers, of course, are preferable for Sunday afternoon or evening, but Compline may be considered as a good substitute, as a first introduction of the present-day Catholic to the Church's sublime prayer-life.

Sunday Compline has been arranged for congregational singing or recitation. Both the Latin and the English texts, printed on opposite pages, have been set to modern notations. While this may not appeal to the Gregorian purist, it appears the only feasible course to follow at the present time, the publishers state. The arrangement of the various parts of Compline is simplicity itself; the most inexperienced congregation will experience no difficulty whatsoever in following the sequence.
