This statement was made by the Most Rev. Luis M. Martinez, Arch-bishon of Mexico and Charge d'Affaires of the Papal Delegation, in an interview granted to a re-porter for Excelsior.

The interview was occasioned by the accusation of Governor Silvand Barba Gonzalez of Jalisco, made at the Governors' meeting at Masat-ian, Sinaloa, that the clorgy in his State is using the pulpit for Axis propaganda.


