Jugoslav King Harnes Priest As His Envoy

LONDON-King Peter of Jugoslavia has appointed a prical, the Rev. Aloyslus Kishar, as Envoy Ex-traordinary and Minister Plenipo-tentiary to the President of the l'olish Republic.

King Peter signed the decree after the Briliah government had given its consens to the appoint-ment and His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Hissley had granted the necessary canonical permission.
