

F. J. Sheed To Lecture Sunday In Culture Series

"A Catholic mind needs muscles. It also needs horizons. Catholic means universal. A Catholic mind will possess the universe, will have an awareness of it, be a citizen of it, be at home and at ease in it.

Such is the claim of Frank J. Sheed of London and New York, founder of the publishing firm of Sheed and Ward, who lectures at Aquinas Auditorium Sunday evening, Mar. 15, at 8:30 P. M.

Mr. Sheed follows the Archduke Felix of Austria as the seventh lecturer in the popular Christian Culture Series.

New York Attracted
The series has attracted considerable attention both within and outside Rochester. At least three priests from New York City have inquired about its format with the view to erecting a similar series in the Metropolitan area.

Some decades ago Catholics lacked their minds for the answers to various objections of a pseudo-scientific and rational nature. Sheed and Ward have insisted, for many years, that Christian truth is not a thing to rally round and defend. It needs no defense. It is to be carried to the enemy. The notion that the best defense is a good offense is the technique developed by the Sheeds. (The Ward, F. J. Sheed and Ward, is the former Felix Ward, now Mrs. F. J. Sheed.)

Topics Listed
"The New Apologetic," the lecture to be given here next Sunday evening incorporates much of this new Sheed technique. F. J. Sheed is the principal worker with Cardinal Hinsley in the new "sword of the spirit" campaign in England. Author of "Communism and Man," "The Map of Life," "Poetry and Life," and "The Nullity of Marriage" are some of F. J. Sheed's works. He has just finished a new translation into modern English of

"The Confessions of St. Augustine." The rough-and-tumble Hyde Park lecture audiences in London have always been enjoyed by Mr. Sheed, a frequent speaker there himself, and the trainer of the young Catholic thinkers who have tested their arguments in those motley groups.

Like all the Christian Culture Lectures, the lecture Sunday is open to the public. It will be followed by a question-and-answer period.

The April lecturer and last for the season will be the great French philosopher, Jacques Maritain. Maritain's article in the current "Review of Politics" is attracting national attention.

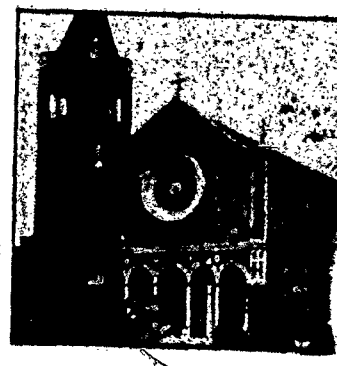

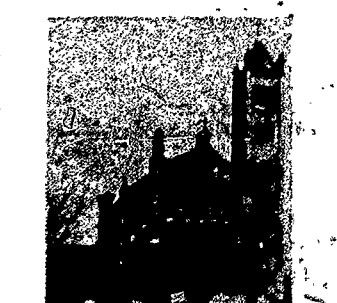
