Nun, Native of Auburn, Marks Golden Jubilee

SALINA, Kans. Former students and friends of Sister M. Bernardine, former teacher at Sacred Heart School here, will rejoice with her Mar. 19 on the occasion of the completion of fifty years of service in the community of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

Born in 1864, in Auburn, N. Y., during the Civil War, Sister has lived to see a third great war in which the United States is engaged. Sister Bernardine came to Concordia, Kans., from Auburn, Jan. 6, 1882, and was received into the order of the Sisters of St. Joseph on Mar. 19, of the same year. She was professed two years later and began her career as a teacher at St. Joseph, Kans. A most successful teacher, she taught in many of the schools of the diocese and elsewhere.

For the past 18 years she made her home at Marymount College.

In the early years of the new century, Paris, Tex., had a parochial school in charge of the Sisters of St. Joseph. There were a good many Negroes in the school and one young Negro lad, irritated at Sister because he had been punished, determined to seek his revenge. He planted a sharp knife over the classroom door in such a way that when Sister opened the door in the morning the knife (the top) would fall on her head and injure her. Fortunately, the knife did no damage and Sister Bernardine escaped unharmed. This was not one of the many experiences in her career of 32 years as a teacher.

Sister Bernardine was one of a family of twelve, nine of whom are living. Joe, Frank and Tom Vail of Auburn, N. Y.; William of New York City; Mrs. Denis Nolan, Mrs. Mary Day, Mrs. Rose Barron and Cecelia Vail, all of Auburn. Her niece, Sister St. Michael of Rochester, N. Y., and her cousin, Sister

In addition to being pastor at La Conception, he was superior of all Iroquois missions and had under his direction 11 Iroquois Cantons from Lewisville to Rochester, Junction.

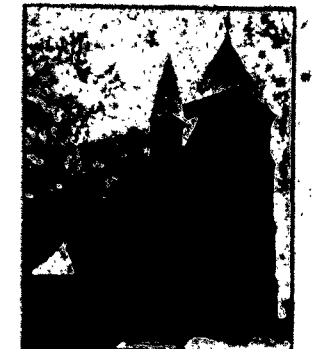
