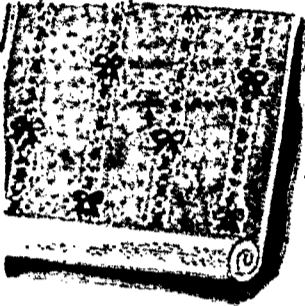

At this meeting the members of the Council were reminded that the primary purpose of the Ladies of Charity is the service to God's poor and to those who would not usually come to the attention of a regular agency, especially if there is a need of special material relief.

Brady will act as chairman, have collected and sorted a supply of approved magazines for use in the local hospitals. Plans for further service at St. Joseph's are being made with the Reverend Phillip McGhan, Chaplain at that institution.

Willing hands are putting much thoughtful effort into the completion of story books for the children in the hospital wards. The members of this committee of the Infant of Prague, of which Miss Florence Kane is chairman, have also started a collection of Easter baskets for their children and will sponsor story telling hours for the convalescents in the wards.
