#### REORGANIZE SOCIETY

Plans were made to reorganize the bands of the Rosary and Altar Society of St. Ann's Church at a recent meeting of officers and promoters held at St. Ann's School. The Rev. Edward R. Dempsey, spiritual director of the Society, presided at the meeting.

According to plans made at the meeting, the parish will be divided into zones. In this way, promoters will be given members to contact in areas consisting of only one or two streets. This reorganization will facilitate the delivering of leaflets by hand promoters. Plans were also discussed to increase the reception of Holy Communion in a body at the seven o'clock Mass on the first Sunday of each month.

The following committee was appointed by Father Dempsey to assist in the reorganization of the Society: Mrs. Leo Didas, Miss Anna Leo and Mrs. Walter Fredricks.

#### Lenten Sermon

"The Judas of Everyday Life" was the topic of the third Lenten talk given by the Rev. Joseph Donavan, assistant pastor of St.

Ann's Church at the regular Sunday evening devotion. Father Donavan gave a psychological sketch of the character of Judas, showing his spiritual deterioration as the love of money gradually supplanted his love of God, until his final degradation, the betrayal of Christ.

Father Donavan pointed out that the average person, having far less spiritual advantages than Judas originally possessed, is therefore even more inclined to betray God daily by disregarding His laws. He gave one rule to assure fidelity rather than betrayal of God: Never to commit, deliberately, even a venial sin.

Funeral services were held March 10, at 9:00 o'clock at St. Ann's Church for Mrs. Mary Baldwin, who died March 8, at St. James' Mercy Hospital. Mrs. Baldwin was a native of Warsaw, but had been a resident of Hornell many years. She was a member of St. Ann's Church; Ladies Auxiliary to B. of M. T.; Women of the Moose; E. A. R. E.; and Erie Veterans' Auxiliary.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Aurilla Russell, one son, Harry J. Baldwin and six grandchildren, all of Hornell.

#### Asks Aid For Care of Evacuated Children

LONDON. — (NC) — The Most Rev. Richard Downey, Archbishop of Liverpool, in a letter to the Minister of Health, has expressed concern about future liabilities in providing for the care of children evacuated to areas where priests and Catholic churches are few.

The Archbishop has spent to date \$20,000 on attempts to solve problems created by the scattering of the children. Most of the children have been sent to areas where previously there were few Catholics. Seven priests have been sent with the children by Archbishop Downey to give full-time attention to their needs.

His Excellency claims in his letter that the presence of the priests has produced a happier and more contented spirit among the children and teachers.

He asks for financial help, and appeals "with greater confidence in so far as our difficulties are due, to a great extent, to the fact that the most Catholic Diocese has been evacuated to the least Catholic reception area."

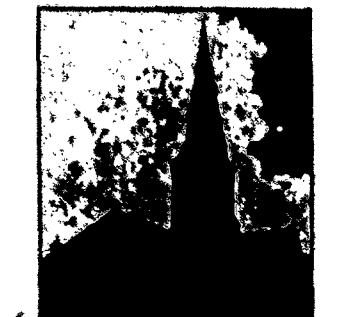

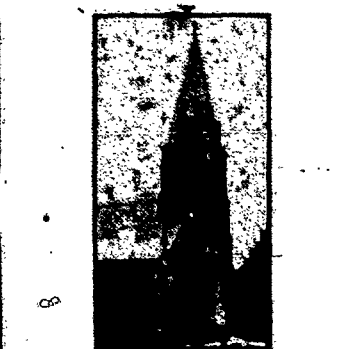

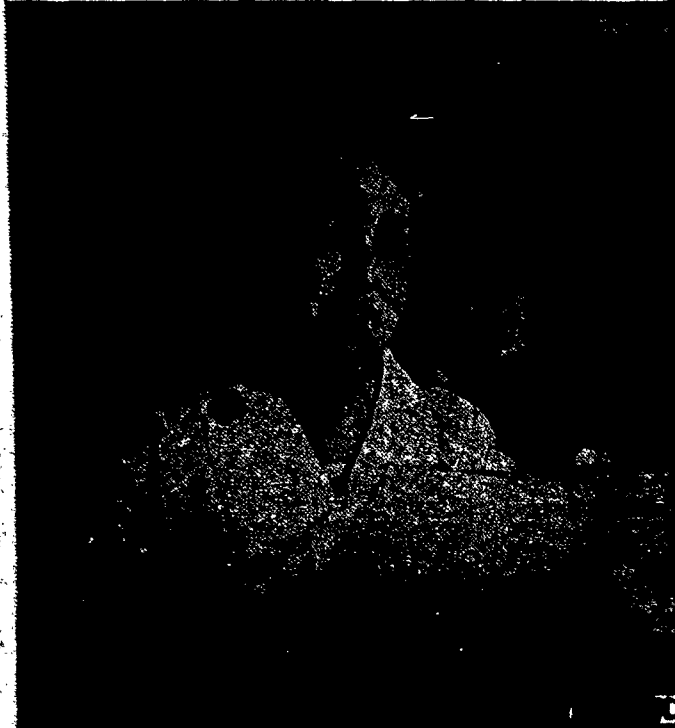
