I have never seen a lovelier lot of people than the dancers of Leonide Massine.

I have never seen dancers like Anna Scarпова and Tamara Tommasova, save in ballets of surf in the sun, apple blossoms in the breeze.

No man has ever danced better than Massine.

Let's Yankovitch, tall as a pine, dances ariel as a fountain.

For the first time I am made aware of what the ballet might do as an art form. Massine, do the Beethoven Seventh! Marshall Field, commission Aaron Copland for music; Orson Welles for scenario, Massine for choreography in a ballet of contemporary synthesis!

Instead of three ballets, there should have been two: Choreutism, Massine masterpieces to music of Brahms, which was not done, and Le Tricorne, which was done, and done beautifully.

The Magic Swan from interminable Tchaikovsky proved musically hack, but surefire box office.

The Sarcophagi of Weinberger was a waste of talent and genius (Alexandra Danileva, Massine), a work of penal superficialities.

That was a happy stroke, to flash V on the curtain with the singing of the Star Spangled Banner. What remains to be done is to burn V in the soul of the people, a job squarely up to the impresario and the poet.

His paternal grandfather enlisted in the Civil War at the age of 64 and served four years. He was held prisoner in the famed Libby prison.

The Government has reversed its former order, which in effect operated as a penalty on members of the depressed class who embraced Christianity.

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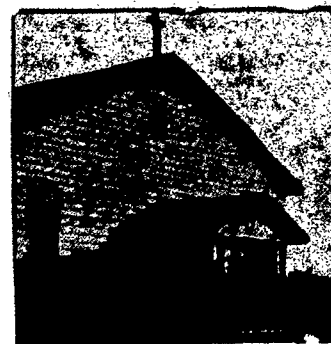
