Seminaries filled the minor offices of the Mass.

The Mass opened the day's observance of the Feast. At noon, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, as guest of the Ladies' Auxiliary, Knights of Columbus, at a well attended luncheon meeting in Powers Hotel.

**Liberal Program**

Two gala celebrations in the evening climaxed the day's observance. At Hotel Seneca, members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and their Ladies' Auxiliary and friends in great numbers thoroughly enjoyed the program arranged by Co-Chairmen Martin J. Carroll and Mrs. Paul Shannon, county president of the Auxiliary. Ballads and dances dear to the Irish heart were on the program. His Excellency was the guest of honor and speaker at the annual banquet of the Knights of Equity and Friendly Sons of St. Patrick in Powers Hotel.

Landing the work of the great saint of Ireland, the Bishop drew parallel between the famed harp and the teachings of St. Patrick to the people of Erin.

The first leaf, he said, represented the tremendous value of their faith, a Faith which stood the trials of the most bitter persecution in world history.

The second signified their devotion to their mother country, a devotion second only to the devotion to the land which gave them welcome.

The third symbolized the willingness of the Irish people to make sacrifices. This gift of sacrifice, the Bishop pointed out, becomes more important now in view of world conditions, when everyone is called upon to make sacrifices.

The Irish learned sacrifice from their glorious predecessors and gave in turn given their best to make a home for their children.

"It is good for us to be here," said Bishop Kearney, "and it is well for us to recall our ancestry, our tradition and our ideals."

In memory of Colin Kelly "Taps" was sounded by Anthony Infantino, bugler. Invocation was given by the Rev. Roy B. Morphy, national chaplain. Toastmaster was Daniel J. O'Mara. Christopher Deanty was chairman of the dinner. Paul V. Pedmore led in singing Irish songs and several soloists were heard.

**Groups Hear Panegyric**

Members of these Irish-American and other Catholic lay organizations attended the Solemn Pontifical Mass in the morning at St. Patrick's and heard Father O'Leary's panegyric.

The eloquent Redemptorist priest stressed the contribution made not only to this country but to the world by St. Patrick who alone converted a pagan nation and sent his missionaries out into other lands in Europe to plant the faith of Jesus Christ.

While those present might be asked to do something more profitable in trying times than the sentimental reminiscing of a distant land and its patron saint, he declared emphatically:

"We could not do better than to see what we are doing here today. Every loyal citizen of the United States who has this country and its way of living at heart should get down to the work of doing it."
