Living Rosary' Will Mark Sodalties' ite On March 25

All sodalties of the city will be presented in a Living Rosary at will highlight the second annual city-wide observance of the birthday of the Holy Mary, to be held on Mar. 25, the feast of the annunciation.

Under the auspices of the Sodality of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral, where the observance will be held, the services will start at 7:45. The Rev. Daniel J. Fraher, assistant pastor of St. Stevens Church in Geneva, will be the speaker of the evening. After each decade of the Rosary "Ave Maria" will be sung. Nazareth Academy's Persian Choir, and the Gregorian Choir of St. Andrew's Seminary will contribute a choral "Ave Maria," while the "Ave Maria" will be sung solo.

Following Father Fraher's sermon a "Silent Holy Mary" during which the lights will be lowered except for the lights on the shrine of Our Lady, will be carried out by members of the congregation. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will conclude the services.
