Fr. O'Donnell's Navy Talk Is Rebroadcast

GREAT YAKES, Ill.—When the Very Rev. J. Hugh O'Donnell, C.S.C., President of Notre Dame University, appeared on the "Meet Your Navy" program, broadcast from the U. S. Naval Training Station here, a transcription was made and the program has been repeated from stations throughout the nation. Father O'Donnell appeared as a guest of Rear Admiral John Downes, Commandant of the Ninth Naval District.

"Ever mindful of the saying that 'the ultimate strength of a nation is in the things of the spirit,' the Commandant has seen to it that religion is accorded its rightful place in the regimen of the Station," Father O'Donnell said. "This excellent training school for the Navy is a credit to our country. It embodies all the features that appeal to American youth, and at the same time prepares the young man for the various branches of the Naval service."

"I wish to give public acknowledgment that the University of Notre Dame is proud to cooperate with the Navy in its war program for the training of future officers."

FRANCISCAN MISSIONERS IMPRISONED IN CHINA

NEW YORK—Twenty-five Franciscan priests and several Brothers in Shensi Province, China, have been removed from their mission stations and placed in "protective custody" by Chinese Communist soldiers, according to word reaching St. Francis' Monastery here. It was said the Franciscans were taken from missions in the country, brought to the city, and imprisoned.

The priests and Brothers, it was said here, belong to the Franciscan Province in Bavaria and are religious exiles from Germany. They have been working in Shensi Province since leaving their own province.

up and live and die in Genoa without speaking or knowing "Italian." For what do we mean by "Italian"? Italian is today the development of the Tuscan dialect of "vulgar Latin." Genoese was and is a distinct language which the common people of Columbus' time spoke, and they knew no other. In fact they continue to speak it today and I have visited churches in the province of Genoa where the sermon is still preached in Genoese on Sunday. At Rapallo (where I spent a winter) where "Italian" only is allowed in school, I found that the children speak Genoese as soon as they leave school and come into the street.

Columbus then, it may be reasonably supposed, never knew "Italian," or knew it very imperfectly. He left Genoa at the age of 14. It was not likely that he would wish to make Genoese (which nobody in the Iberian peninsula understood) the language of his subsequent life. He sailed on Portuguese and Spanish ships. The language of his companions became his language. He read extensively, as all concede, and he read and wrote and spoke in the language that was then the language of the seafaring nations. There is no mystery in his subsequent use of Spanish, and not "Italian."

How Arthur Brisbane's name got mixed up in my mind with those of Columbus and Galileo must be left for another occasion. My space is used up—and perhaps the patience of the reader too.
