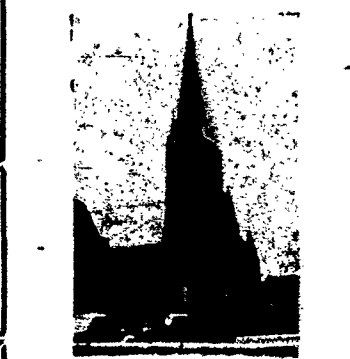

Women Have Sent NCCS Club 10,000 Cookies in 5 Months

CONEWAGO, Pa. — Eight members of the Conewago Deanery Council of Catholic Women devote every Friday morning, and donate all necessary materials and talent, to keeping filled the soldiers' cookie jar in the USO club operated by the National Catholic Community Service in Harrisburg.

"We figure that we have baked 10,000 cookies since last October—we haven't kept count of the doughnuts," was the brief statistical report of the Deanery Council President who organized the service. Special delivery mail carries the finished products each week to the Harrisburg club to provide a traditional home-like touch for the week-end service guests.

The "cookie and doughnut squad" was the Council's answer to the problem of aiding NCCS work from a rural area many miles away from the nearest club.

Inmates Built Church Of Australian Convict Camp Century Ago

BRISBANE, Australia — The erection by convicts at Clinton Prison, Dannemora, N. Y., of a church dedicated to St. Dismas, the Good Thief, recalls that Australia can boast a convict-built church which ante-dates the American chapel by nearly a century. The church was built on Norfolk Island, early convict settlement.

Mention of it is made in a report by Bishop Foding, Australia's first Bishop, in 1842, which cited the terrible condition of the convicts on the occasion of Bishop Ullathorne's visit five years previously. Stating that "an improvement has taken place in the island which is little less than miraculous," Bishop Foding said:

"A large church has been built by the convicts under the invocation of St. Vincent de Paul."

Reverse Order Penalizing Low-Caste Hindu Converts

MADRAS, India. — Depressed class Hindus will continue, after conversion to Christianity, to be eligible for fee concessions and other privileges in public schools and institutions, under a new act of the Madras Provincial Government.

The Government has reversed its former order, which in effect operated as a penalty on members of the depressed class who embraced Christianity.

LONDON. — When General de Gaulle visited Liverpool recently, he and members of his staff attended Mass in Liverpool pro-Cathedral. The celebrant was the Archbishop, the Most Rev. Richard Downey.

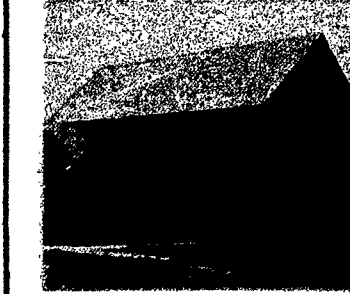
