AMERICAN PRIEST NAMED MIDWAY ISLAND PASTOR

HONOLULU.—Midway Island now has a Philadelphia priest and Maryknoll Missioner as pastor, Father James R. Hughes. The Most Rev. James J. Sweeney, Bishop of Honolulu, today announced Father Hughes' appointment to this unique and perilous post. The United States Navy, in charge of the island, has arranged for the priest's transfer from Honolulu to his new work, where his parishioners will comprise, for the most part, men in government service.

Midway Island is 1,200 miles from Honolulu. The Japanese have attacked it, but have failed in their efforts to occupy it.

Boston.—The rapid growth of Medford has caused its Bishop, the Most Rev. Tibello Salazar Herrero, to create two new parishes in recent weeks. One will be dedicated to the Sacred Heart, and the other is to be known as Calvary parish.

St. Bonaventure College Activities

ST. BONAVENTURE.—The Rev. Celsus Wheeler, O.F.M., director of the Civilian Pilot Training Class at St. Bonaventure College, will attend a meeting in New York City Saturday of flight contractors and co-ordinators of the C. A. A. sponsored course, which will result in immediate acceleration of the program at St. Bonaventure, as well as other places.

The contemplated expansion of the program came in the wake of an announcement by Secretary of War Harry H. Hines, commanding all pilot training facilities of the C. A. A. for exclusive use in the war effort.

The effect of this announcement is to make the C. A. A. Civilian Pilot Training Program a direct "feeder" for the Armed Air Services. The quota for the elementary course, which is being offered at St. Bonaventure, has been raised from 20,000 to 40,000, the country-over. This is expected to result in immediate doubling of the present pilot training activities here, and the possible inauguration of the secondary course next fall.

The Rev. Roman Pfeiffer, O. F. M. of the St. Bonaventure Biology Department, is preparing a paper to be delivered at the annual meeting of the American Society of Ichthyologists and Herpetologists, in New York City next month. The thesis will represent a summary of research by Father Roman during the past year in the study of fishes, reptiles, and amphibians.

The Rev. James Anthony Schuck, O.F.M., has been appointed college infirmarian to succeed the Rev. Ernest J. Sheehan, O.F.M., who left here Saturday to assume new duties in the Chaplain Corps of the U. S. Army. It was announced by the Rev. Celsus Wheeler, O.F.M., guardian of the monastery.

Eighty-eight specimens of blood volunteered by students and faculty members, were added to the "bank" of the Buffalo Chapter, American Red Cross, during the visit of its mobile unit to the campus last week.

Prof. John L. Worden of the Biology Dept., and Richard W. Mullen, a member of the senior class made the first donations.
