"There must be no mental groping, no doubt, no uncertainty in the minds of our people as to the reasons why our country is fighting in this conflict—the reasons why our country flict—the reasons why our country will continue to fight until the things for which we fight are once again made secure to us and our posterity."

Heard In U. S., Canada

Parallelled notes were sounded in addresses by J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the Federal Bureau of Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and Clarence Manion, Dean of the Law School at the University of Notre Dame. The program, entitled "America Fights for God-Given Rights," was heard on stations from cost to coast in the United States and Canada.
