ALL NIGHT VIGIL

Taking their example from the Nocturnal Adoration Society the men of the Holy Name Society will again keep an all night vigil before the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday night.

This practice was inaugurated in the parish last year and was well received by the men. An even greater response is hoped for this year.

Leaders for each hour from ten to six have volunteered their services to contact and sign up men to watch at least one hour during the night. While the Holy Name men are taking the initiative in this movement, it is by no means restricted to the society and all the parishioners are invited and encouraged to "watch one hour" with our Lord on the anniversary of the night during which He prayed alone in the garden.

Members of the Senior Sodality were pleased to be able to spend last Sunday as a "day of recollection," in silence and prayer with their divine Master. Assisted by Rev. John Maney of St. Andrew's Seminary who conducted the exercises, the Sodality spent an inspiring and fruitful day. They are most grateful to Father Maney for his fine conferences during the day.

The Discussion group sponsored by the Senior Sodality during the season of Lent will hold its final meeting next Sunday evening. This last meeting will take place in the Church Hall at 7:45.

Postponed this week because of the "Blackout" throughout the city, the Red Cross first aid class will resume its work Tuesday evening in the School Auditorium at 7:20. Nearly 200 men and women are attending this course, covering ten weeks of intensive work and training. All who pass the examination at the end of that time will receive a Red Cross certificate.

This year marks the fortieth anniversary of the organization of Blessed Sacrament. This great milestone in the history of our beloved parish is to be observed by the school children in the form of a pageant. Various steps in the progress and development of the parish will be depicted. Practice has already begun on several scenes and a lively interest in the early history of the parish and its accomplishments is surely evident.

The parish Discussion Group will bring its study of the Bible to a close this Friday evening, March 27, in the church hall following the Stations of the Cross. The final chapter in the pamphlet on the Bible, entitled "How to Read the Bible" will be discussed at this meeting.

HOLY WEEK SERVICES

Holy Week services at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church will begin with the blessing and distribution of the palms on Palm Sunday at the 10 o'clock Mass.

Holy Saturday—Morning services begin at 8:45 with blessing of the New Fire, Blessing of the Paschal Candle and of the Easter Water. High Mass at about 8 o'clock.

Easter Sunday—The Masses will be at the usual times: 6, 7, 8:30, 9:30 and 11:30.

The Mission will close on Saturday morning with Mass, General Communion, sermon and imparting of the Papal blessing, accompanied by the granting of a special indulgence.

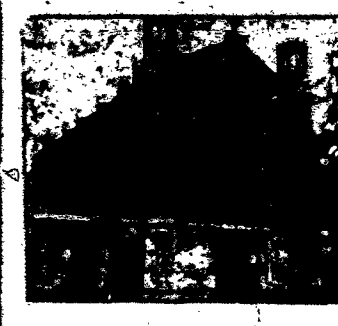
