With 18 priests in attendance funeral services for Mrs. Josephine Sauer Frank, mother of the Rev. William F. Frank, pastor of St. Pius Church, Cobcocton, were conducted on Monday, Mar. 23, 1942 at 70 1/2 South Avenue and at St. Boniface Church.

Mrs. Frank, widow of the late Theodore Frank, died Mar. 18, 1942, at the residence, 465 Gregory St., at the age of 81 years. During her long life she was a devout Catholic and was an exemplary Christian mother.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was offered in St. Boniface Church by her son, Father Frank, assisted by the Rev. Eugene Golding as Deacon and the Rev. Francis Taylor as Subdeacon.

At the close of the Mass Bishop Kearney gave a very inspiring and encouraging talk to the Sisters.

In conclusion he said: "At a time when the enmity of the Priests and Pharisees was gradually increasing against her Divine Son, it was Joseph who talked to Mary and calmed her fears and was a source of encouragement and consolation to her. So you, too, share that vocation with St. Joseph, as members of a Community especially dedicated to him.

"You have a similar contribution to make to your little Nazareth where your pupils gather about your desk and where you try to see in each child your responsibility and your life work. This is particularly true in these times of stress and trial—and, therefore, we are happy to join with you this morning as you return to your Motherhouse Chapel in order to gain increased inspiration, that while honoring St. Joseph at this Mass, you may ask of him the strength, power and influence necessary to carry on the work to which you have dedicated your lives."

**"The Lady Is Willing"—B**

Never quite making up its mind whether to be comedy, bedroom farce or mother love drama, "The Lady Is Willing" is an example of a picture that is neither fish, fowl nor good, red herring. Marlene Dietrich plays an actress named Miss Madden—"Madden" with that heavy Teutonic accent?—who finds a baby, has her maternal instinct aroused and then discovers that in order to keep the baby, she will have to find a husband. That's where Fred MacMurray comes in. The two stars are able enough; Stanley Ridges is good in a supporting role and Arline Judge returns to the screen briefly and unimpressively. There is also a baby who will cause the usual amount of exclamations and clucking. It's good to see Aline MacMahon again—there's something warm and real about her that has been missing from the screen since she has been absent. One only regrets that her role in "The Lady Is Willing" doesn't give her a stronger part in which to return to the screen. Incidentally—if anyone cares—she's our choice for the much-vaunted role of Pilar in "For Whom the Bell Tolls."

**"Valley of the Sun"—A-I**

Here's a quote from the review of "Tuna" which appeared in this department last fall: "If we must have Westerns, let's have them all like 'Tuna.' Or, we should say, let's have George Marshall direct them all—and they will be pretty much like 'Tuna.' Marshall, who also directed such pictures as 'Destry Rides Again,' knows the difference between slapstick and real comedy, and he brings it in

humor naturally, not at the expense of action."

Excuse it, please. George Marshall's new Western, "Valley of the Sun," attempts the same formula but this time it doesn't come off. The picture is a confused mélange of the usual Western action and comedy that is definitely slapstick—nothing else. Marshall gets little help from his shopworn story and none of the actors—Lucille Ball, James Craig, Dean Jagger or Sir Cedric Hardwicke, in a particularly deplorable role—rise above their material. There are some lively moments—some good fights, a couple of picturesque Indian war dances, a contest for superiority between an Indian and a white man. But a few good scenes don't make a good picture.

**"South of Tahiti"—A-2**

One would imagine that "South of Tahiti" is meant to be a satire on the Dorothy Lamour jungle princess type of picture. Certainly it wasn't meant to be taken seriously, but it isn't very funny either because the humor is sophomoric horseplay of the most elemental type. Brian Donlevy and Bud Crawford are good actors who are wasted here and the persevering will be rewarded with a few glimpses of part and pretty Arnela, who started out so promisingly as John Barrymore's leading lady a few years ago.
