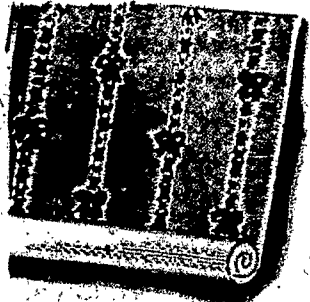

EASTER WEEK SERVICES

Traditional services will mark the first Holy Week to be observed at Our Lady of Lourdes Church which a year ago was about in the middle phase of its construction. On Palm Sunday the palms will be blessed at the 10:30 a. m. Mass. During the week Mass will be celebrated at 8 each morning. On Wednesday evening the final sermon in the Lenten series on the Stations of the Cross will be delivered by the Pastor, Rev. Leo G. Schwab. Mass Holy Thursday will be celebrated at 8 o'clock and will be followed by a procession of the children of the parish to the repository on the side altar. On Holy Thursday evening there will be a Holy Hour from 8 to 9. On Good Friday morning the

Mass of the Presanctified will be at 8 with Procession. The devotion of the Stations of the Cross will be held at 7:45 with Father Schwab delivering the sermon on the Seven Last Words. Easter Sunday morning the parish will inaugurate the custom of Family Easter Communions. Each family will be asked to receive Communion in a group and then hold a Communion Breakfast in the home.

MISSION SCHEDULED

An impressive service Saturday night with a capacity congregation attending concluded the Mission which was conducted at St. Anthony's Church last week by the Rev. Joseph Garrity, O.M.I.

The service was featured by a procession of the children of the parish and with the Rev. Bernard C. Hann, the pastor, and Father Garrity officiating, assisted by Father Vogt, prayers were recited dedicating the men of the parish serving in the armed forces to the patronage and protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The pledge of allegiance to the Flag was recited and the congregation joined in the singing of the Star Spangled Banner.

Father Garrity imparted the Papal Blessing and the services concluded with the Solemn Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

On Sunday morning after the 8 o'clock Mass a Father and Daughter Communion breakfast was held in the church hall under the aus-

ices of the Young Ladies' Sodality. Father Garrity addressed the breakfast on the "Power of Women Over the Lives of Men."

Holy Week Services

Father Hann announces the schedule of Holy Week services as follows:

Mass each morning during the week at 8.

The women and girls of the parish are expected to receive Holy Communion on Holy Thursday morning. Holy Communion will be distributed at 8, 7, 7:30 and at the Mass at 8 which will be followed by a procession of the children, escorting the Blessed Sacrament to the Repository on the side altar. Holy Hour from 7:30 to 8:30 p. m. Good Friday, Mass of the Presanctified and Procession, Stations of the Cross at 3 and 7:30 p. m.

Holy Saturday, Blessing of the Easter Fire, Easter candle and Easter water, followed by Mass. The Easter water will be distributed after Mass. Lent ends at noon Holy Saturday. Confessions afternoon and evening in preparation for the Feast of Easter.

War, Bad Weather Raise Canada's Fish Prices

Because of its increased consumption during the penitential season, a noticeable advance in the cost of seafood in Canada was brought strikingly to attention during this Lent. War activity off the east coast of Canada, coupled with the worst weather in years, reduced the production of seafood in the Maritimes. On the west coast, production slowed down in the interval in which white fishermen were taking over some 1,100 boats formerly operated by Japanese. The result was that Canada found seafood costing 15 to 20 per cent more this year than it did last Lent.

The price "ceiling" has been taken off the cost of fresh, frozen and cured cod, herring, sardines, haddock, smelts, mackerel, clams, hake, halibut and all fresh water fish except salmon. But, while the War Prices Board has abandoned the "ceiling," efforts have been made to keep down costs and some measure of control is thus retained.

Cod filets, selling 25 cents a pound this Lent, brought only 18 and 19 cents a year ago. Finnan haddock has gone from 18 to 25 cents a pound, and similar advances have been made with all fish.

New Bishop Greeted In Mexican Diocese

MEXICO CITY.—The Most Rev. Gerardo Anaya y Diaz de Bonilla, new Bishop of San Luis Potosi, was greeted upon his arrival there by his predecessor, the Most Rev. Guillelmo Tritschler, new Archbishop of Monterrey.

The two prelates went to the Cathedral for the signing of a Te Deum, and the reading of the document which transferred Bishop Anaya from Chiapas to his present See. The people of San Luis Potosi gave their all enthusiastic ovation. Mgr. Jose G. Anaya, Secretary of the Papal Delegation here, joined his brother when he stopped over in the Capital and journeyed with him to San Luis Potosi.
