HORNELL—Holy Week services at St. Ann's Church have been definitely scheduled, according to a combined Easter message and bulletin sent out this week by the Rev. Andrew T. Dissett and assistant pastors. The Rev. Joseph Illig, C. M., of the Vincentian Order, will arrive on Wednesday of Holy Week to conduct special services. Father Illig will conduct the Holy Hour at 7:45 o'clock on Holy Thursday; the Three Hours' Agony on Good Friday and will speak at all the Masses on Easter Sunday. Father Illig will also assist in hearing Confessions on Wednesday and Saturday.

Masses of all school children, 3:30 p. m. to 5:00 and 7:00 to 8:00 p. m. Confessions, for all women of the parish who possibly can arrange to come.

Holy Thursday—Communion for all who possibly can arrange to receive, especially all women and children of the Parish. Communion given at 6:00, 6:30, 7:00, 7:30 and during the Solemn High Mass at 8:00 a. m. Procession after the Mass, Visits to Blessed Sacrament in Repository during day. All are requested to pay a visit, 7:45 p. m. Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Holy Hour and Benediction.

Good Friday—4:00 a. m. Mass of Prostration followed by adoration of the cross. Collection for Holy Land during mass. 12 noon to 3:00 p. m. The Three Agony of Our Lord. Stations of the cross at 2:30 p. m. and adoration of the cross, 7:45 a. m. Stations of the Cross followed by adoration of the Cross.

Holy Saturday—7:00 a. m. Blessing of Easter Water and Prophecies. 8:00 a. m. Mass and Holy Communion. After mass distribution of Easter Water until 9:30 a. m. and from 2:00 p. m. to 3:00 p. m., 3:30 p. m. to 5:00 p. m., 7:00 p. m. to 8:00 p. m. confessions, especially for the men of the Parish and women who wish to come.

Easter Sunday—Masses and Holy Communion 6:00 a. m., 7:00 a. m., 8:30 a. m., 10:00 a. m., and 11:00 a. m. All parishioners should embrace the opportunity to receive Holy Communion on this Joyous Holy Day.

Lenten Sermon
"Modern Pilates" was the subject of the Lenten sermon delivered last Sunday evening by the Rev. Joseph Donovan, assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church. Father Donovan gave a psychological diagnosis of the character of Pilate, showing how his will was affected by extreme love of self.
