**HOLY WEEK SERVICES**  
 Holy Week commences at St. Mary's on Sunday morning with the blessing and distribution of Palms at the 11 o'clock Mass. There will be Masses on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings at 7, 8 and 12:10 o'clock. The confessions of the children of the parish will be heard on Wednesday morning after the 8 o'clock Mass. Confessions for the adults will be heard commencing at 3 o'clock on Wednesday afternoon. There will be Lenten Devotions combined with the Novena of the Miraculous Medal on Wednesday evening at 7:15 o'clock.

**Holy Thursday**  
 Holy Communion will be given at 5:30, 6:45, 7:30, and 8 o'clock and also at the 8:30 o'clock Mass which will be a Solemn High Mass followed by a procession to the Repository. There will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament continuous throughout the day. At 7:30 on Holy Thursday evening there will be a public Holy Hour which will be conducted by Rev. Francis B. Burns, a professor at St. Bernard's Seminary. The Junior and Senior Sodalties will have their Holy Hour from 9 until 10 o'clock. Miss Gertrude Cora, chairman of the Eucharistic Committee of the Senior Sodality, and Miss Louise Ciampi, chairman of the Eucharistic Committee of the Junior Sodality are in charge of the arrangements. This Holy Hour of the Sodality has been an annual custom of the sodalists of the parish for several years. The Holy Name Society will commence Nocturnal Adoration Services at 10 o'clock. Rev. Joseph McNamara, moderator, has appointed a leader for each hour and the members of the society have been divided into groups so that there will be several in attendance throughout the night. The Adoration Services will come to an end at 6:00 A. M. on Friday morning.

 The Mass of the Pre-sanctified will be celebrated at 8:30 on Friday morning. Immediately after the Mass there will be Veneration of the Cross.  
 On Thursday, Friday and Saturday of Holy Week only one Mass is permitted in each Church. This year Good Friday falls on the First Friday of April. This means that Holy Communion will not be given.
