### COMMUNION BREAKFAST

The Altar and Rosary Society held its seventh annual Communion breakfast Sunday morning March 29 at the Mark Twain Hotel. The members assembled in the school hall and then marched to the church where they received Communion in a body at the 7:45 Mass.

The breakfast began with the recitation of Grace by the Rev. J. Moriarty pastor of St. Mary's and Moderator of the Society. During the breakfast, Daniel W. O'Day offered a group of songs, accompanied by his wife at the piano.

The guest speaker was Cornelius J. Milliken one of the best known of the Catholic speakers in the Southern Tier. Sacrifice and prayer that the cause of our country may prevail in this vast struggle were urged by Mr. Milliken.

"Today our effort in this war is to preserve our precious rights and liberties for we know without them life is empty and desolate," Mr. Milliken said. "We want them for ourselves, we want them available to all peoples for surely, where they exist, there people may come to God, who commanded that his teachings be spread to all peoples."

"To this cause we give our wholehearted support, our unity and our sacrifices; for this we fight the Hitler, the Mussolinis, the Hirohitos and all who would de-

troy our rights. With the effort we give for God and country in the spirit of sacrifice we give also our prayers and Holy Communion that out of this abyss of ruin and desolation may arise a new world in tune with divine love that brought it into being.

"We have a right to expect that the peacemakers strive to build the post war civilization on a foundation of moral and social justice for all peoples, that there shall be no conquered, that a true brotherhood of many may come into being.

"We have a right to demand that aid of God be invoked and that his representatives be invited this time to sit at the peace table."

As a conclusion to his talk Mr. Milliken gave a moving account of the composition of that famous song "The Rosary," by Father Whalen who wrote the words as a tribute to his sister.
