**AWARDED MEDAL FOR SCULPTURE**

**Ancient Lenten Relics  
 Remain Intact In Germany**

The little town of Telgte, Westphalia, not far from Mainz, a town that has been a pilgrim center since the Middle Ages, is associated with two Catholic relics which are remembered with particular interest during the Easter season. One is the "Lenten Veil," which was completed in elaborate crochet work by ladies of the nobility there in 1623. This veil is now kept in a Berlin museum. Lenten veils were used in many mediaeval churches to conceal the altar from the eyes of the congregation, the object being much the same as that now achieved by covering crucifixes and holy images with veils toward the end of Lent. Of the few veils of this kind still preserved, the one of Telgte is perhaps the most famous. It is 22 feet long, 12 feet wide, and is made up of 33 square fields depicting a scene of the Passion of Our Lord. Even more unusual is the Telgte

Sundial, dating back to 1610, on which the hours of the day are associated with the sorrows of the Mother of God. An almost exact replica of the original was installed on the outer wall of the Telgte home museum in 1925. In the center of a square about seven and a half feet in size, from which flames spread out in all directions towards the hour numerals, stands a statue of the Blessed Virgin. The flames bear inscriptions pertaining to Mary's sufferings. A large symbolic sword which pierces Mary's heart takes the place of the hand on an ordinary sundial. The rays of the sun shining on the dial and sword cast the sword's shadow, indicating the time of day. Fixed in the wall above this sundial is the following ancient Latin inscription:

"The Clock of the Mother of Sorrows indicating the last hours of life and the death of Christ."

**KNIGHTS HAVE ASSISTED  
 1,000,000 SERVICE MEN**

LONDON.—The Knights of St. Columba, English counterpart of the American Knights of Columbus, have opened 55 canteens for service men in various parts of England. It was reported when a new hostel was opened in Liverpool on the site of the new Cathedral. The Liverpool hostel, and others in London and Malta, offer sleeping accommodations to soldiers, sailors and airmen. Elsewhere, refreshments and recreation are provided, and it is stated that the Knights have catered to more than 1,000,000 men. When the Liverpool hostel was opened by the Lord Mayor, high ranking officers representing the three services attended, together with the Archbishop, the Most Rev. Richard Downey, who praised the Knights for having accomplished all their work without making a general appeal to the public for funds.

**New Charity Bureau**

Alexandria, La.—The Most Rev. Daniel F. Desmond, Bishop of Alexandria, has named the Rev. Gerard J. Dacosta, of St. Francis Xavier's Cathedral, director of a new Charity Bureau. The purpose of the bureau is to assist any Catholic family that may need clothing, medicine or groceries, to assist in placing orphans and the aged and to establish contact with necessary bureaus and agencies, such as the Department of Public Welfare.

**Recover 12th Century  
 Relics of St. Hilary  
 From Paris Auction**

VICHY — The twelfth-century reliquary, containing the relics of St. Hilary, fourth-century Bishop of Poitiers, missing since the turmoil of June, 1940, has been recovered to the great joy of the people of Poitiers.

The keeper of the reliquary, M. Housse, had sought it diligently but unsuccessfully in the vicinity of Poitiers. Recently, he learned that among some objects to be sold at auction at the Hotel Drouot, Paris, was a reliquary and, from the description given, it might well be the one containing the relics of St. Hilary. He arranged to go to Paris, identified the reliquary and succeeded in preventing its sale.

**Retreats in Liverpool  
 For Women War Workers**

LONDON.—Retreats for women serving in the army, navy and air force auxiliaries are being arranged at the Cenacle Convent, Liverpool. Other retreats are to start for munition workers.
