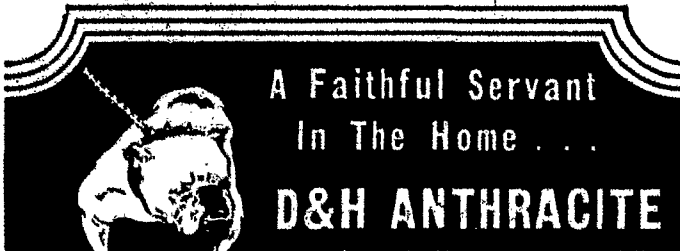

ENGLISH, WELSH BISHOPS ORDER WEEK OF PRAYERS

LONDON. — The Catholic Hierarchy of England and Wales has designated the period from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday as one of special prayer and self-sacrifice.

The Bishops call upon their people to offer up their prayers and good works during Holy Week that they may receive strength to face the problems and struggles of the present hour, that they may be consoled in their sufferings, that eternal rest may be granted to all those who fall in the war, and that a just and lasting peace may follow the present conflict.

King George VI of England has proclaimed Palm Sunday a National Day of Prayer, the sixth such since the outbreak of the war. The King asks that his people wherever possible "unite in giving thanks to Almighty God for past blessings and in humble prayer for strength and guidance in facing the tasks that lie ahead."

Dr. Leonard has just returned from San Francisco where she addressed the annual meeting of the national association.
