A leading role is taken by the Rev. James R. Keane, O.S.M., founder of the Perpetual Novena in honor of Our Sorrowful Mother. The film was sound tracked by members of the world-famous Chicago Symphony Orchestra, the choir from Holy Name Cathedral, Chicago, and seminarians from St. Mary of the Lake Seminary, Mundelein, Ill.

Announcing the showing of "The Eternal Gift," the Catholic Workers quote the following from the current bulletin of St. Joseph's House of Hospitality:

"The Catholic Worker Movement, of which we are the Rochester branch, is one built primarily on religious principles and is centered around the Liturgy. For it is through offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass that we come to understand how truly we are the members of the Social Body of Christ, and can thus act upon the command: 'It is My Will that you go and evangelize the world.'"

Each day at St. Joseph's House from 100 to 150 men are served breakfast and supper; clothing is distributed to those who need it. As soon as a fire-escape can be procured, lodgings will be provided for the homeless. The work is supported by voluntary contributions of the Catholic Workers, by donations of food and money from friends and by the sale of old newspapers collected by a truck, also donated.

The Catholic Workers hope to realize enough money from the sale of tickets to "The Eternal Gift" to liquidate their debts and to provide the bulk of the fund needed for the construction of a Chapel at St. Joseph's House. Tickets for "The Eternal Gift" can be had by calling Main 8789. Calls for donations of old newspapers can be made at the same number and the truck will call. There will be no advance in the price of the tickets for the Regent Theater showing of "The Eternal Gift." A light comedy will provide the second feature, it is stated.

Smith, former governor of New York, who has joined the Board of Directors of Russian War Relief, Inc., in a statement released at the New York headquarters, states: "No American can fail to recognize that aid in all forms for our allies is the quickest and cheapest means available to us of striking at Hitler. The Russian army and people are serving magnificently as the spearhead of our fight and I have joined the board of directors of Russian War Relief, Inc. in order to do what I can to aid them. I feel, too, that suffering and want such as that which has inevitably followed the ravages of war in Russia lays an inescapable duty upon every Christian."
