Father Crotty Dies; Served at St. Joseph's

Word of the death in Pittsburgh of the Rev. Edward J. Crotty, C.S.S.R., 41, on Mar. 31, 1942, has been received by the Rev. Stephen W. Aulbach, C.S.S.R., rector of St. Joseph's Church where Father Crotty was stationed with the other Redemptorist Fathers, about nine years ago.

While in Rochester, from April 2, 1932, to April 17, 1933, Father Crotty preached the Mother of Perpetual Help novena on Wednesdays at St. Joseph's Church with the Rev. William J. Doherty, C.S.S.R., who is still stationed here.

A series of special articles on the Novena was carried in the CATHOLIC COURIER at Father Crotty's request at the time and a large number of the papers was distributed at the church at the novena services.

Born May 12, 1900, at Somerville, Mass., the young priest was ordained June 24, 1928. He attended St. Mary's College, North East, Pa., and while a student contracted influenza and was given up by the doctors. His recovery is attributed to the intense prayers said for that intention.

From Rochester, Father Crotty was transferred to the Redemptorist community at Frederiksted, St. Croix, Virgin Islands, where he stayed 3 years. After that he went to Saratoga Springs, N. Y., and from there to Pittsburgh, Pa., where he labored zealously for the past several years at St. Philomena's Church and, as in Rochester, spread great devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

His death followed an operation. It is learned here.

Named Counselor



Very Rev. Msgr. Egidio Vagnoni, Auditor of the Apostolic Delegation, in Washington, who has been appointed to the rank of Counselor in the Vatican diplomatic service, assigned to the Apostolic Delegation here, Monsignor Vagnoni came to Washington in 1932 and has been stationed in Washington for the past ten years.
