Directed into the writings of St. Thomas Aquinas by Bloy, Jacques Maritain discovered that here was an answer to every query of the human mind, and the truths of Sanctifying Grace, the gifts of the Holy Ghost so overwhelmed him with its splendor that the next evidenced step was to seek entry into the Church of Christ. Leon Bloy was the godfather at the baptism of Jacques and Raissa Maritain. Maritain's influence in America becomes more extensive each year.

In demand as a visiting professor, Maritain has accepted positions in Harvard, Virginia, Chicago, Columbia and Princeton where he is now engaged. His first visit to America was at the invitation of the Basilian Fathers at the University of Toronto. Together with Etienne Gilson, he lectured there for the past several years.

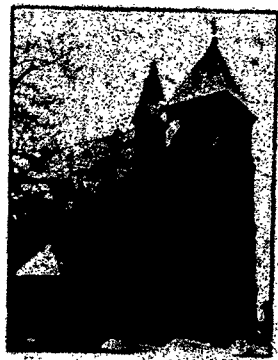
