Priest Dies As He Leaves Confessional

OCEAN SPRINGS, Miss.—The Rev. Denis O'Sullivan, of St. Athanasius Church here for the past three weeks, died in the church Holy Thursday morning as he stepped into a pew from the confessional. Retired from active duty and residing at St. Stanislaus College—Bay St. Louis, Miss., for the past three years, Father O'Sullivan, 66, had come here to substitute during the absence of the pastor, the Rev. Joseph Holland.
