Eulogy Found 8 Years After Death

NARBERTH, Pa.—Eight years ago Albert I. King of the Belgians, died in a fall from a cliff and the world mourned. Next day Harry Donahue of the Philadelphia police fell before a gangster's bullet and his friends wept.

Just the other day Harry Donahue, Sr., of the Atlantic trolley, discovered in the floor of his car an eight-year-old pamphlet, entitled "Albert of the Belgians—Harry of the police," published by the Catholic Information Society of Narberth, Pa.

The humble conductor's eyes lit as he grasped the purpose of the Narberth story: "The sovereignty of an entire nation and the guardianship of a city's welfare had one great thing in common — their way of knowing, loving and serving God."

"King and policeman are now so mixed," continues the pamphlet, "but Albert and Harry will live on forever. They have gone, we believe, to join—and to behold with—Peter, the fisherman who died on

a cross—Panny, the colored woman who washed other folk's clothes—Michelangelo, the painter of cathedrals and chapels — Michael Donnelly, the painter of fences and barns—Louis, the scientist who gave us "pasteurization" Ludwig, the waiter who served smiles with his beer."

That night Mr. Donahue wrote to the Catholic Information Society: "Harry of the police was my son," he said. "It thrilled me to read his name and to know that he wasn't forgotten."
