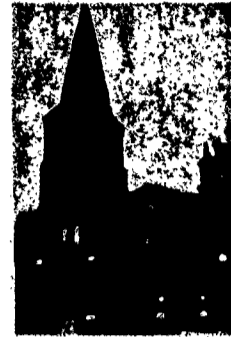

Channel Island Nuns Contact England Via Vatican Radio

LONDON.—Nuns in the Channel Islands, between England and France, now in German occupation, have again got a message to the English mainland via Vatican Radio.

They are concerned about the welfare of two of their Sisters, now in England. The message came from the Sisters of Mercy in Guernsey. It reported that the nuns are carrying on their school work with a roll of 32 pupils, and that the anxiety of the nuns is about the missing Sisters.

The message reported that the two priests at the parish church in Guernsey, Canon Hickey and Father William Kirk, are well. The Channel Islands are in the Portsmouth Diocese. There has been no direct communication with England since early in the war.

GENEVA.—Holy Name members of societies in St. Francis de Sales and St. Stephen's churches will attend the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union annual convention in Rochester on Sunday, May 2.

This will be the tenth annual convention of the organization. Heretofore the convention sessions have been afternoon meetings. This year, in connection with the celebration of the tenth anniversary, a full day's session is planned.

The convention will open with solemn High Mass at the Holy Redeemer Church in Rochester. This will be followed by a luncheon in one of the downtown hotels which will be addressed by a speaker of national prominence in Holy Name work.

Peace-Time Exploit Wins Pilot Honor

LONDON. — Capt. John Kelly Rogers, Dublin-born Catholic pilot who brought Premier Winston Churchill home from Bermuda, has been made a member of the Order of the British Empire (O.B.E.) for a dramatic peace-time exploit in the Belgian Congo.

The 6,000-ton flying-boat "Corsair" had made a forced landing on a small stream and would probably have been abandoned but for the pilot's ingenuity. With the aid of an engineer, Capt. Kelly Rogers dammed a number of streams to make an artificial lake, from which he took off to fly the huge boat to safety. He received his decorations from the King at Buckingham Palace.
