Salvage Group Urges Piling Up Scrap Metal At Curb For April 25 Pickup

With the slogan, "Show Your Metal; Get in the Scrap," Rochester's Salvage Committee today prepared an all-out drive to round up every available ounce of old iron, steel, zinc, copper, aluminum and brass from the city's 26,000 homes, apartments, stores and hospitals. Saturday, Apr. 25.

Working under William T. Nolan, chairman of the salvage committee, and Charles H. Steele, head of the scrap collection committee, more than 300 volunteer employees of the city Department of Public Works in 45 city trucks will pick up the scrap on the collection day, after a whirlwind publicity campaign designed to reach every house.

Nolan and Steele, outlining what each householder must do to cooperate with the drive and insure a steady flow of metals for the nation's war machine, stated:

1—Scrap metal should be piled by householders on the curb the day or night before the metal drive date, Apr. 25. Curb piling is necessary in order to give the workers time to cover the entire city in the one day.

2—All types of metal household equipment, old tools, metal furniture, fire chains and auto equipment, wire, fencing, pots and pans, radio and lamp parts, garden implements, fireplace equipment, will be welcomed by Uncle Sam's war industries.

"Your donation of scrap metal," Nolan said, "may enable you, personally, to have a part in knocking out an Axis plane, soldier, tank or submarine. We have got to supply the material if we want to make good our promise to the troops to 'keep 'em flying'."

HOLD OUT TIN CANS. Officials warned householders NOT to put tin cans in the Apr. 25 metal collection. Tin cans are being collected by other organizations, including the Salvation Army and Women's Educational & Industrial Union. Tin cans, to be collected at all, must first be cut open at both ends and flattened out and wrapped in bundles.

The DPW trucks will take iron and steel scrap to the Rochester Iron & Metal Company, 336 St. Paul. All other metals will go to Rochester Smelting & Refining Co., 26 Shearer, and the Charles Frank Metal Company, 545 Oak St. These firms are donating their yards, equipment and employees' time to sort the metals and deliver them to the large refining and smelting plants, which will pay prevailing prices for it. The proceeds will go entirely to the City Defense Fund for local defense projects.

Members of the Junior Chamber of Commerce will check the sorting and weighing of the scrap as it is unloaded from the trucks.

Record on Hitler Breaks Records

"You Can't Do Business With Hitler," a 15-minute recorded radio program, has broken best-selling broadcasting records.

The program is distributed weekly, at their own request, to 729 of the 836 radio stations in the United States. Some of these stations broadcast it as many as four times a week. In addition, it goes to 22 stations affiliated with schools and colleges, two stations in Hawaii, two in Canada, one in Alaska, one in Canal Zone and four in Puerto Rico.

The Office for Emergency Management, which distributed the program, has made inquiry among broadcasting authorities and can find records of no other program so widely distributed.

"You Can't Do Business With Hitler" is based on the best-selling book by Douglas Miller, who was Commercial Attache of the American Embassy in Berlin for fourteen years. It is prepared by the Radio Section of the OEM with Miller's Collaboration.

Dr. Carroll Receives New Vatican Honors

VATICAN CITY.—The Rev. Dr. Walter S. Carroll, American priest attached to the Papal Secretariat of State, has been appointed to the Supreme Council of the Missionary Union of the Clergy, representing the English-speaking peoples.

The appointment of Dr. Carroll, who is a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, was made by His Eminence Pietro Cardinal Fumasoni-Biondi, Prefect of the Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith. (Dr. Carroll's uncle, Thomas and John Carroll, reside in Rochester.)
