It is for this reason, the Scapular Militia aims to cloth thousands in the miraculous Habit of Our Lady of Carmel. The Scapular devotion is for the living as well as the dying -- to help them in numberless dangers and temptations.

During the month of May, Our Lady's month, the Militia will conduct a national "March of Dimes" -- "A Cent each Day" in May -- will Ten in Mary's Garb Array -- a March to help bring the Queen of the World in Her kingdom of human hearts.

CONVERT COLORED WOMAN IS CONFIRMED AT 97

WASHINGTON -- A 97-year-old Colored woman with vivid memories of pre-Civil War days was among 15 old people of the home of the Little Sisters of the Poor here who received confirmation last week at the hands of the Most Rev. John M. McNamara, Auxiliary Bishop of Baltimore and of Washington.

She is Miss Mary Ann Mickens, born October 18, 1844, on the Virginia estate of Edward C. Marshall, youngest brother of the first Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. She was received into the Church in 1938.

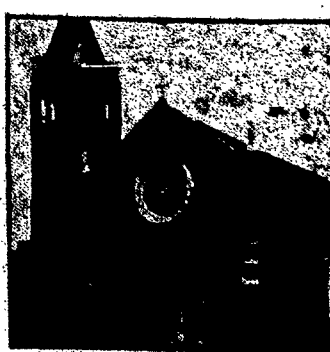
