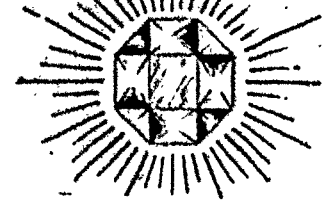
the parish an opportunity to get together in a friendly, informal way. Entertainment was provided for the gathering in the form of group singing and several movies put on by a parishioner.
